

APPROVED + PROHIBITED ITEMS

All Residence Halls

- Hot air popper
- Slow cooker/crock pot
- Blender
- Electric can opener
- Coffee maker or coffee pot
- Refrigerator (limited to 220 watts and 10 cubic ft.)
- Microwave oven (limited to 600 watts)

- Hair dryer
- Electric razor
- Radio, stereo, VCR, or DVD player
- Television
- Keurig
- LED light strips

For kitchens in the Woods and the Village

- Air fryers
- Cooking Knives
- Toasters
- Toaster ovens
- Waffle irons

- Rice cookers
- Slow cookers/crock pots
- Panini presses
- Tea/hot water kettles
- Blenders

Unapproved/Prohibited Items

- Toasters or toaster ovens
- Open-coil burner or hot plate
- Deep fat fryer or any appliance capable of heating grease to a burning point
- Electric skillet or wok
- Electric griddle, grill, George Foreman grill, or open broiler
- Any kind of propane or other fuel
- Personal air conditioners

You will receive specific driving directions and instructions for where to unload your items based on your assigned residence hall to your UNC Asheville email address in August.



CHECKING IN

Checking In with Your RockyCard Student ID

Once you arrive in the unloading area, faculty and staff will greet you with additional instructions. All belongings will be moved to staging pallets while you (the student) check-in either outside of or in the lobby of your residence hall.

If you have uploaded your RockyCard photo, we will have your ID printed for you to pick up at Check-In.

If you have <u>not</u> uploaded a photo for your RockyCard prior to arriving on campus, you will not be able to move in or get your room key until you go to the RockyCard Office (located in Governors Hall) to have your RockyCard made.

FAQs

How do I pick a meal plan?

All residential students are required to have a meal plan. You will be automatically enrolled in the Unlimited Plan with \$50 Bulldog Bucks. You may choose to make changes to your meal plan by logging into the RockyCard portal at <u>rockycard.unca.edu</u>. You will have until the 3rd day of classes to make changes. You will receive additional instructions on how to make changes to your meal plan in early August. **Keep an eye on your UNCA email account throughout the summer!**

Do I get a campus mailbox?

Campus mailbox numbers and keys will be distributed during the check-in process at your residence hall on Move-In Day.

Where can I do my laundry?

Laundry facilities are located in your residence hall. All laundry is **FREE** for resident use.

Who do I contact to get help with raising or lowering my bed?

We will have staff available to assist with arranging furniture, raising and lowering beds, and installing bed rails. Once you arrive at your room, if you need assistance please email <u>resmaint@unca.edu</u> and our team will respond quickly. **Please do not request assistance before you arrive at your room.**

Does housekeeping clean my room?

Your room and bathroom will be clean when you arrive. Trash receptacles are conveniently located near the outside of the residence hall.

Residents are responsible for the cleanliness of their rooms, bathrooms, common spaces (living rooms), disposing of trash and keeping all public areas in clean condition.

THE RESIDENCE LIFE TEAM

The Residence Life team can't wait to welcome you to the Bulldog community! Our professional live-in staff of **Area Directors** and **Graduate Community Directors** will be in the residence halls when you arrive on Move-In Day ready to answer any questions you may have. Our team of **Resident Assistants** (RAs) will also be there to greet you during Move-In and will assist with anything you need from getting your room key to connecting your computer to the internet. Your RA will continue to be a resource for you throughout the school year and can help with your transition to UNC Asheville's campus and college life.

Director for Residence Life

Full-time, professional staff member who manages residential areas. They are the primary administrator for day-to-day community operations.

Area Directors (ADs)

Full-time, live-in professional staff members who supervise RAs and GCDs and coordinate community building events and activities.

Graduate Community Directors (GCDs)

Live-in, graduate students who provide academic and personal support and supervise RAs.

Resident Assistants (RAs)

Resident Assistants are fellow students who live in the residence halls and work for the Housing and Residence Life team to build community and serve as peer leaders. RAs facilitate community involvement and assist in the management of student concerns.
